They are making demands, which are not just, and which cannot be acceded to, without creating great sectional difficulties, which will mar the welfare of this country. Besides wishing to humble Ontario, and prevent her from getting more power, and from reaping the just award of the boundary commissioners, they wish that Lower Canada shall have better financial terms as one of the confederate provinces than she
