An Expert Shot

From the *Illustrated London Telegraph*. Ellsworth Bissmeyer is remarkably skillful with a rifle. One of his latest shots is described as follows: A piece of half-inch gas pipe was inserted through a heavy piece of iron as a base. At one end of the pipe he affixed the blade of a hatchet, so that the sharp edge rested against the pipe. On either side of the hatchet he hung a glass ball. Standing off at a distance of forty feet, he fired with a Winchester repeating rifle at the exposed end of the gas-pipe, through which the bullet passed and was split on the hatchet edge, each half breaking the glass ball on either side of the object. Having done this remarkable shot to his satisfaction in the ordinary manner, he tried it in a different manner. Holding the gun over his shoulder, he sighted through a small mirror he held in his left hand, and fired with his back to the object. Again did the ball pass through the gas-pipe, split on the hatchet edge and break both balls. Still another way was tried. Bending over, he held the rifle down and sighted under his leg, again making the shot successfully.
