The smallest clearings last year were in August, but those of last month are \$3,000,000 less than that bad month. The total for February is only \$19,209,907 as against \$27,205,606 in January, \$23,704,497 in February, 1893, and \$23,610,467 in February, 1892.

The Chicago wheat market yesterday afternoon broke about a cent, which dampened the ardor of the bulls. The weakness was owing to Bradstreets' statement that supplies in Europe last week increased 3,000,000 bushels and that stocks all over the world increased 1,807,000 bushels within the week. 




