Dairymen's Association of West- ern Ontario.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEET NEXT ANNUAL
CONVENTION IN BRANTFORD ON JANUARY
19TH, 20TH AND 21ST, 1897.

The Directors of the Western Dairymen's
Association met on Monday, April 6th, in
the Secretary's office, London. There were
present, President A. F. MacLaren and R.
M. Ballantyne, Stratford; J. S. Pearce,
London; Harold Eagle, Atscliffe Station;
J. N. Paget, Canboro; H. White, Hawke-
ville; John Prair, Harrison; Thos. Gibson,
Fordwich, and J. W. Symington, Cam-
lachie.

There was a large amount of business
transacted in reference to the future work
of the Association another coming cheese
season. Owing to the probability of the
British Dairy Farmers Association holding
its annual gathering for 1897 in Canada the
Board passed a resolution extending to that
important body, a warm welcome from the
Association and the Dairymen of Western
Ontario should it visit Canada next year.
This organization is the most important
farmers' association in Great Britain, of
which the Earl of Derby formerly Governor
General of Canada was president last year,
and should its members decide to visit
Canada in 1897, special efforts should be
made to show them the importance of
Ontario as an agricultural country.

Grants will be made this year to the
Dairy Departments of the following exhibi-
tions and shows: Western Fair London,
\$100; Industrial Fair, Toronto, \$50, and
the Provincial Fat Stock and Dairy Show,
\$50. The President and Secretary were
appointed to represent the Assn. on the
Board controlling the Fat Stock and Dairy
Show.

The next annual convention of the Assn.
will be held in Brantford on January, 19th,
20th and 21st, 1897. The Secretary will
correspond with a number of prominent
speakers on dairy topics with a view to
securing their services for this important
gathering.

A circular letter will be sent by the
Secretary to the cheese factories in the
West asking that the opening for the
season's business be delayed as long as
possible so as to lessen the output of early
fodder cheese and allow the market to
right itself before the later makes come on.
A further effort will be made to organize
a syndicate of factories for more uniform
instruction and inspection. The association
is very desirous of having one of these
syndicates in operation this present season
as an object lesson to show what can be
done by systematic effort and is prepared
to make a very liberal offer to factories
willing to join a group this season.

A resolution of condolence was passed
expressing the sincere regret of the Board
in the death of the late esteemed Hon.
Secretary of the Association, Mr. C. B.
Chadwick, of Ingersoll. Mr. Chadwick
was the first president of the Canadian
Dairymen's Association organized in 1867
and the active secretary of the Western
Association till his retirement in 1892, when
he was succeeded by the present secretary,
J. W. Wheaton.

Last Winter's Snow Fall.

Mr. R. F. Stupart, director of the Tor-
onto Meteorological Observatory, reports
that in Ontario generally the total snowfall
of the winter has been greater than the
average, the more northern counties and
the central counties on the higher portion
of the province showing the greatest excess
which in some districts was as much as
three feet. In Muskoka and Parry Sound
the excess was about a foot, and at most
points near Lakes Erie and Ontario but a
few inches. The snow fall has also been
excessive in the southwestern portion of
Quebec, particularly during the latter half
of the winter.
