The bill has been warmly debated upon. The Opposition contend that the law as it stands is a good one and that the Judges of the Supreme Court have a right to a voice in the appoint ment of Sheriffs, and that the proposed new law will make the Sheriff's office a partizin one and liable to frequent changes. The Government say that the system of appointing sheriffs should be the same as that by which the Judge of Probate, Registrar of Deeds, etc., are appointed. The Government are held practically responsible by the people for the appointment and dismissal of Sheriffs, therefore they say the responsibility should be really theirs. The Givernment quote Ontario and New Brunswick, where the system they propose has been in operation some years as examples of its favorable working. As regards the charge that it will make the office a partizan one, the Govern ment contend that as the bill provides that a Sheriff once appointed shall hold the office during good behavior, it would be impossible to dismiss him unless a specific and well sustained charge was made, consequently it would be to his own interest to confine his political leanings to the simple ex-

ercise of his franchise.
