

Fill the cup under perch with sulphur, insect powder or coal oil, and it is IMPOSSIBLE for vermin to reach the fowls while roosting. It is a well-known fact that thousands of these little pests lodge in the crevices, at ends of perch and walls of coops ready to make their nightly visit to the birds. DIRECTIONS—Screw the Brackets to the walls or partitions on EACH SIDE at any desired height from the floor or drop board, and one to two feet from rear wall so that tails of birds will not come in contact with wall. Make perch of 2 x 3 or x 4 scantling, broad side up, cut them just long enough to come even with the outer edge of cup, this will leave the bracket holes in perch about one inch from the e. d. This prevents the fowls crowding against the walls or roosting on arm of bracket. Bore a one-half inch hole in perch at each end and cut a little out with a narrow knife to suit the taper on bracket pins. The perch is readily removed for cleaning and brackets do not interfere with cleaning of drop board. NEVER screw the brackets to the rear wall as it does not leave room for the birds to roost clear of wall. If there is not a board partition between the pens put in narrow upright or cross pieces and screw the brackets to these.

Always keep in mind that no part of the fowls should be close to the walls or you will defeat the object of this invention. The leading poultry breeders pronounce this the simplest and most practical device ever introduced for the purpose. Weight of brackets 3 1/2 lbs. per pair. For sale by
