LIVE STOCK MARKETS.	

TORONTO, June 6.—All told 66 loads of offerings were on the market this morning. A good deal of trading was being done, but while in many lines there was no actual quotable alterations, the tone of the market was weaker all round. Advices from England continue depressing, and though we had a good deal of buying in export cattle there was not the buoyancy in business usual at

this time of year.

CATLE—The actual range for shippers to day was from 4 1-4 to 5c per pound. For butchers' cattle there was a slow demand, the audden advent of hot weather and the the sudden advent of hot weather and the chespness of eggs interfering very much with the butchers' trade. The outside price was 4c, and most of the trading ranged from 3 1-2 to 3 3-4c per pound: common stuff agait sold in a few instances as low as 2 1-2c, and 2 3-4 to 3c were the figures at which much inferior stuff changed hands.

SHEEP AND LAMBS—All told we had not more than 70 on sale. Sheep were dull and not wanted at from \$5 to \$6 each, according to whether they were clipped or woollen. Spring lambs were slow at from \$3.50 to \$4 25 each.

CALLES - About one hundred were here.

Calves - About one hundred were here, and prices were weaker all round; only very good average calves fetched \$5.50 and \$6

cach. The demand was off.

Milch Cows The supply exceeded the
business requirements, and a ses were slow at from \$30 to \$40 cach.

Hogs-Just six hundred were here, and prices weakened; the best hogs weighed off cars sold at for \$6.50 to \$6.60 per cart. All sold, and probably just now all that come along will sell, but the demand was more slack and prices much easier to day.




