MACAO!

("Imposto do Sello.")

Having a few of the Macao fiscal stamps surcharged in red for postal use, I offer the following of these varieties, all in an entire condition, to my philatelic friends as long as my small supply lasts:—

5 reis on 10 r.	- - - -	\$5 00
5 " 20 "	- - - -	1 75
5 " 60 "	- - - -	1 00
10 " 10 "	- - - -	1 25
40 " 20 "	- - - -	1 75

These stamps being entire are extremely rare, as they are perforated at the top, bottom and on either side so that the original value as fiscals is separated from the body of the stamp when used postally and were sold in that condition to the public. Of course those that have thus been deprived of their fiscal value are not worth nearly as much to collectors as when entire. Philatelic history records no similar instance among provisionals.

The prices of those which have been deprived of their fiscal value are as follows:—
