A Manual of the Criminal Law of Canada.—By John Henry Willan, Counseller at Law.

MR. WILLAN, in a pamphlet of fifty-eight pages, has laid before the public the leading principles of the Criminal Law of the Province. Without any pretensions to elaborate execution, the work must be useful in the highest degree to Magistrates and Students at Law: afferding them ready means of ascertaining what the general principles of our Criminal Code are. and giving them facilities of reference to standard authorities, which cannot fail to be of great benefit.

Mr. Willan has made the subject matter of the Manual his pecul'ar study; and from our knowledge of his experience, we were at first impressed with the belief that the work would turn out of practical utility.
