Sealed tenders are requested by me on behalf of the Corporation of the County of Hastings, up to MONDAY NOON, 27TH SEPTEMBER, 1902, with plan, strain sheets and specifications for a steel, pin-constructed, overhead Truss Highway Bridge to be erected upon abutments at Beaver Creek, about two miles north of Marmora Village, in the County of Hastings, Ontario.

Bridge to be one span, 95 feet long from pin to pin, with roadway 16 feet wide in clear steel joists and 5 inch cedar covering, with wheel guards on blocks and hub-guards.

Bridge to carry a moving load of 120 pounds at least, to each square foot of floor area.

The abutments will be ready for the superstructure by the 20th day of October next, and the steel erection to be finished on or before the 10th day of November, 1902.
