Pascal Lamy Commissioner for Trade, European Commission

Pascal Lamy was born on April 8, 1947, in Levallois-Perret, France. He is a graduate of the École des Hautes Études commerciales, the Paris Institute of Political Studies, and the École nationale d'administration. From 1975 to 1981, he worked in the French civil service, first with the Inspectorate-General of Finances, and then the Treasury.

From 1981 to 1983, Mr. Lamy served as an adviser to the Minister for Economic Affairs and Finance. In 1983 and 1984, he was deputy chief of staff to the Prime Minister.
