Department of External Affairs,
Ottawa, Ontario, Canada, today that Canada,
in cooperation with other countries who are members of
the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (GATT) first
announced in 1961 for developing countries. The
agreement is being given as the provisional
arrangement which was outlined by the
Secretary of the House of Commons on November 14,
1969.
