Mr. Mackenzie King (Prince Albert), a Member of the King's Privy Council, laid before the House, by command of His Excellency the Governor General,—Final Report of the Royal Commission appointed to investigate the administration of the Department of Customs and Excise of Canada.

On motion of Mr. Mackenzie King (Prince Albert), it was ordered,—That 1,200 copies in English and 400 copies in French of the Final Report of the Royal Commission on Customs and Excise be printed forthwith and that Standing Order 64 be suspended in relation thereto.

Mr. Dunning, a Member of the King's Privy Council, laid before the House, by command of His Excellency the Governor General,—Annual Report of the Department of Railways and Canals for the fiscal year from April 1, 1926, to March 31, 1927.
