

forces, elect to surrender any right had by him under subsection (2) of section 56 of that Act to pay for any period of service described therein in the manner authorized by that subsection, whereupon he shall be subject to the provisions of subsections (5) and (6) of this section in all respects as though he had elected under this Act, at the time of the surrender of such right, to pay for that period. 5

Recovery of amounts due.

(8) Where any amount payable by a contributor into the Superannuation Account by reservation from pay and allowances or otherwise has become due, but remains unpaid at the time of his death, that amount, with interest at four per cent per annum from the time it became due, may be recovered in accordance with the regulations from any allowance payable under this Act to the widow or children of the contributor, without prejudice to any other recourse available to Her Majesty with respect to the recovery thereof, and any amounts so recovered shall be credited to the Superannuation Account and shall be deemed, for the purposes of paragraph (c) of subsection (1) of section 8, to have been paid into the said Account by the contributor. 10 15 20

BENEFITS:

HOW COMPUTED, ETC.

Kinds of benefits.

8. (1) In this Act,
- (a) "annuity" means an annuity computed in accordance with subsection (1) of section 9;
 - (b) "cash termination allowance" means an amount equal to one month's pay for each year of pensionable service to the credit of the contributor, computed on the basis of the rate of pay authorized to be paid to him at the time he ceases to be a member of the forces; and 25 30
 - (c) "return of contributions", means a return of
 - (i) the amount paid by the contributor into the Superannuation Account, and
 - (ii) any amount paid by him into any other account or fund and transferred to the Superannuation Account, 35
 without interest.

Duration of payment.

(2) Where any annuity or annual allowance becomes payable under this Act it shall, subject to the regulations, be paid in equal monthly instalments in arrears and shall continue, subject to this Act, during the lifetime of the recipient and thereafter until the end of the month during which he dies. 40
