Hon. René Tremblay (Minister of Citizenship and Immigration): Mr. Speaker, in order to complete answers to questions Nos. 2,537 and 2,538 given yesterday, I should like to table copies of the correspondence exchanged between the Department of Citizenship and Immigration and any individual, including members of parliament and people writing in their names, about the deportation of Onofrio Minaudo and Giuseppe Catalanotte.

BUSINESS OF THE HOUSE

Mr. Bell: I take back what I said.

Mr. McIlraith: —the insurance legislation amendments, the Corporations and Labour Unions Returns Act amendment; and the resolutions ratifying trade agreements between Canada and Hungary, Canada and the U.S.S.R., and Canada and Bulgaria.
