Public Service Collective Bargaining indicates remarkable speed considering the great task involved.

In relation to another question asked about amendments to the Financial Administration Act and the Civil Service Act which are necessary as a result of this collective bargaining legislation, I should like to assure hon. members that appropriate legislation will be introduced as soon as that is physically possible. With the indulgence of the house, after this legislation has been given second reading I hope we can move to item No. 53 on the order paper involving the authorization of a joint committee to consider this legislation. It is the plan of the government, when we complete the redistribution debate, to proceed with second reading of this bill and then move to second reading of the two other bills involved. They would then be referred as quickly as possible to the special joint committee so that the necessary legislation can be passed, we hope, by July.

There was only one other point raised which I think I should answer at this time. I refer to the point in respect of the independence of the Public Service Staff Relations Board and the arbitration tribunal about which the hon, member for Burnaby-Coquitlam spoke. I should like to assure the hon, member and the committee that it is the intention of this legislation and of the government that these shall be completely independent bodies appointed for terms which will secure their tenure and make them completely independent of any government influ-

Mr. Bell (Carleton): Mr. Chairman, perhaps the minister will be good enough to answer the two questions I raised in respect of the future roles of the national joint council and the pay research bureau.

Mr. Benson: I am prepared to deal with those more fully during second reading of the bill.
