1. There has been no basic change in the Post Office policy within the past 24 months with respect to the regulations and requirements governing the construction of Crownowned Post Office Buildings. It is still required that a Post Office be classified as a Semi-Staff Post Office before a request is made to the Department of Public Works for the construction of a Crown-owned building.

As part of the Supplementary Federal Government Winter Construction Program, during the past two winters a number of small Crown-owned buildings were erected for Revenue Post Offices in those locations in certain designated areas and areas of high winter unemployment.
