The Honourable Senator Beauregard from the Standing Committee on Finance, to whom was referred the Bill (163), intituled: "An Act to amend the Special War Revenue Act," reported that they had gone through the said Bill and had directed him to report the same to the Senate with one amendment, which he was ready to submit whenever the Senate would be pleased to receive the same.

The said amendment was then read by the Clerk, as follows:-

Page 2, lines 23 to 31. For new section 113 (1) substitute the following:-

113. (1) Every person required, by or pursuant to this Act, to pay or collect taxes or other sums or to affix or cancel stamps shall keep records and books of account in English or French at his place of business in Canada in such form and containing such information as will enable the amount of taxes or other sums that should have been paid or collected, or the amount of stamps that should have been affixed or cancelled, to be determined.

The said amendment was concurred in, and— With leave of the Senate, The said Bill, as amended, was then read the third time.

The question was put whether this Bill, as amended, shall pass.

It was resolved in the affirmative.

Ordered, That the Clerk do go down to the House of Commons and acquaint that House that the Senate have passed this Bill with one amendment, to which they desire their concurrence.

The Honourable Senator King laid on the Table:-

Copy of Order in Council P.C. 5771, dated 27th July, 1944, providing for temporary postponement from military training of coal delivery-men and restricting their voluntary enlistment in the Armed Forces.

Exchange of Notes between Canada and the United States of America constituting an Agreement respecting the payment of expenditures on defence installations in Canada and in Labrador, signed at Washington, June 23/27, 1944. (English and French versions.)

Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the Bill (171), intituled: "An Act to amend the Civil Service Superannuation Act," was read the second time, and—Referred to the Standing Committee on Banking and Commerce.

The Senate adjourned.
