

What Eleven Railroads Will Do for Pontville



ELEVEN RAILROADS converging from various points on the Continent, will come to **Pontville**, through the Quebec Bridge.

ELEVEN RAILROADS will have to sort, shunt and prepare hundreds of freight trains every day, in the **Pontville** Yards, for, the heavy traffic provided by the National sea-port of Quebec will require thousands of cars for the handling of imports and exports to and from this port.

ELEVEN RAILROADS will gain access to Quebec through the Quebec Bridge, immediately in front of **Pontville**. Before crossing the Bridge, **all** the trains will have to be sorted in the freight yards at **Pontville**, where hundreds of brakemen, engineers, shunters and mechanics will reside, close to their work.

ELEVEN RAILROADS are as many links in a long chain of progressive elements. You hear many towns boast of their two or three railways. **Pontville** has eleven, eleven wide, strong arteries with a generous flow of rich glowing traffic. **Pontville** has eleven, and of these, three are **TRANSCONTINENTALS**.
