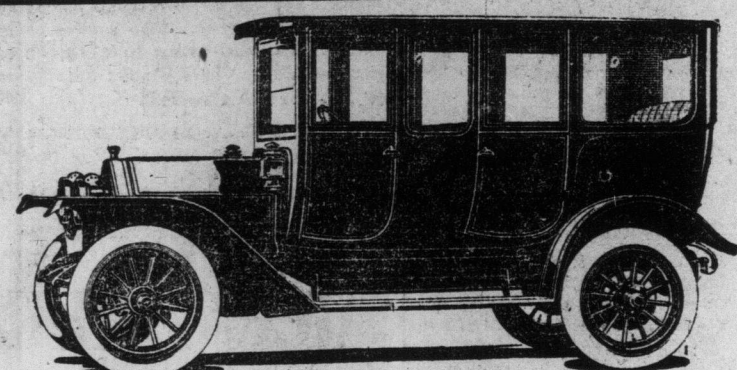

Ottawa Ice Races

The Stakes Filled Satisfactorily

OTTAWA, Dec. 7.—A matter of interest to horsemen in all parts of Canada and the northern states was the announcement to-day of the stake entries for the trotting meets next month of the Ottawa and Hull Driving Clubs.

The Ottawa meet takes place at Lansdowne Park, Jan. 4 to 10, while the Hull Club opens its gates at the Ottawa River track Jan. 15 and continues until Jan. 21. Every thing indicates two of the finest harness horse ice meets in the history of Canada.

Six of the Ottawa stakes and five of the Hull stakes will be for the Ottawa and Hull stakes, and it is certain that great fields will be seen in action. The class entries do not close until Dec. 23.

Amorose, the entries will be found this name of Prince C. owned by James Farley, Plattsburg, N.Y. Prince C. is one of the most promising trotters in harness, having won second money in the \$50,000 stake at Readville this fall.

Coast Jack, who holds the world's record for a mile on a half-mile track (.507), will also be here, as well as The Bel, Jennie W., Hal B. Jr., Doye B., and Dark Hal. The fields in fact will bring together the greatest array of trotting and pacing talent ever seen in Ottawa. Twenty-five thousand dollars will be hung up in prizes.

The Lansdowne Park track is already in grand shape, and that on the Ottawa River will be laid out as soon as the river freezes. The entries will be found on the Hull side, the booths, stables and grandstand being built on logs, so there will be absolutely no danger.

Dozens of fast steppers are working out daily at Lansdowne, and more will be here the first part of next week. Horses are entered from all parts of Canada and the United States.
