

BECKER ORDERED GUNMEN TO MURDER ROSENTHAL

Leader of "Strong Arm Gang" Was Desperate Over Dead Man's Intention to Tell All He Knew, and Exclaimed "Rosenthal Has Lived Too Long—He Has Got to Be Put Out of the Way."

NEW YORK, July 30.—Rose and Rosenthal has lived too long. He has got Webber's confession of their complicity in the murder of Rosenthal caused a sensation in official circles that is without precedent, but the arrest of Lieut. Becker, and the placing him in the Tombs was the climax which threatened to shake the American police system to its foundations. District Attorney Whitman firmly believes that the story of police graft is as yet only half told, and the next two or three days will see the arrest of several officers higher up in the service.

Actual Murderers. The actual murderers, according to the men who have turned state's evidence, are "Lettie Louise" or Louis Rosenberg, Harry Howitz or "Gib the Blond," Frank Muller or "White Jack" Lewis, and "Dago Frank" Crodero. The last named is the only member of the gang who has yet been placed under arrest. These men were all members of the notorious "Big Jack" Zelig gang.

They had piled themselves with liquor, and then went out and shot Rosenthal for a price which is affirmed to be in the neighborhood of \$5000.

Terror-stricken, Rose told how he met Becker in company with Webber a few days before the murder was committed, when Becker emphatically declared that the killing had to be gone through with, or he would send them all up for a term.

Murder Plot. Rose and Webber say they believed that Lieut. Becker would send them away, and had the power to do it. Then the murder plot unfolded itself.

Monday night came and with it the word for the gunmen to get together. Rose told how he got the assassins together, and how, after the killing, he went over to the Hotel Metropole to see how the job had been done. Rose, that lay dead upon the sidewalk with a tablecloth spread over his body, Rose says he went to a telephone booth and called up Lieut. Becker, but he was so unnerved by the shock he could only gasp: "My God, this is horrible!"

Becker, Rose says in his confession, replied over the wire in a steady voice: "Oh, don't worry. I'll protect you. Wait a few minutes and I'll be right down. Where will you be?"

An appointment was made to meet at Forty-second-street, within a short distance of the scene of the murder. There Rose says he met Webber and Becker, and Webber corroborated the Rose statement. They talked over what was to be done under the circumstances, and parted after Becker had assured them that everything would be all right.

The chase of the slayers became hot and finally Rose says that Becker advised him over the telephone to surrender, but that everything would come out all right. "Of the real murderers, Rose says in his confession: "These poor devils did not know what they were doing. They were full of booze. They had been told to kill, and they went out and did what they were told."

Webber and Vallon in their confessions supplied many missing links in the confession of Rose. Speaking of Becker and his alleged connection with gambling, Rose said: "Why, of course, I was Becker's collector. Everybody knew it? Murder. Webber himself says that his protection payments for his gambling to Becker thru Rose were \$125 a month. Lieut. Becker, who has been suspended, spent a quiet night in the Tombs.

"This is an awful plight for an innocent person," said Becker this morning. The three prisoners, Rose, Webber, and Vallon, were still in a state of terror this morning, the guarded by a squad of detectives, who looked them in a room in the district attorney's office. Webber was hysterical, and frequently wept during the night.

That an investigation will be undertaken by the city into the police department that will rival the sensational morning, the guarded investigations appeared to be a foregone conclusion to many police officials.

District Attorney Whitman said: "I am well pleased with the progress we have made. I think it has been a good day's work. I am not in a position to talk about the grand jury proceedings, but the statements made to me were startling in the extreme, and I am bound to say that each of them seemed amply corroborated. I think this is the beginning. I hope to clean up the whole affair."

Dougherty Protests. Police Commissioner Waldo positively refused to comment on Becker's arrest when he reached headquarters, but his assistant, Deputy Commissioner Dougherty, issued a statement in justification of his own actions in the case, declaring that he had never had anything to do with Becker, who reported direct to Waldo.

TRAINS FOR HARVESTERS

First Will Leave Maritime Provinces on August 12.

MONTREAL, July 30.—(Can. Press.)—The C. P. R. to-day announced the dates of the numerous harvest excursions which it will run to carry to handle the crop this year. The excursions will commence from the maritime provinces on August 12. The second, leaving on August 15, will be for the benefit of prospective harvesters in the Province of Quebec and in Eastern Ontario as far as Kingston and Renfrew. The third will leave August 20 and will be run from Toronto and west to Sarnia and south thereof, while a fourth will start on August 23 from Northwest Ontario and the district between Toronto and Kingston and Sharbot Lake.

The company has also arranged for additional excursions to be run from August 20 and all points east in Ontario, Quebec and the maritime provinces on August 23, and from Toronto and all points west, August 30.

The rate from Quebec and Ontario will be \$10, while a rate of one-half cent per mile will be given from Winnipeg to western points.

BRISTOLIANS ARE COMING

Delegation, Including Lord Mayor, at Montreal To-night.

MONTREAL, July 30.—(Can. Press.)—The delegation of Bristol citizens who are coming to Canada to attend the Cabot anniversary at Halifax on August 14 and 15 are due to arrive in Montreal to-morrow evening on the Canadian Northern liner Royal Edward. They consist of the lord mayor of Bristol, with the lady mayor and Miss Wills, Mr. and Mrs. G. Pailiner Martin and Henry Riseley.

Mr. Riseley has taken great interest in promoting trade between Canada and the port of Bristol, and was a member of the Bristol delegation which toured Canada a couple of years ago. Sir Wm. Mackenzie is also on the Royal Edward.

U. S. AGAIN PROTESTS

Mexico Held to Account for Injuries to Americans.

WASHINGTON, July 30.—The United States has again protested to the Mexican Government, and to General Orozco, leader of the revolutionists, against attack upon American citizens and property in northern Mexico.

Secretary Knox to-day officially renewed his notice of two months ago, that the United States would hold Mexico to strict account for all damages, and unofficially notified Orozco that he would be held personally responsible for damages to Americans of their property. President Madero has promised to send more troops to northern Mexico.

John Dargavel Dead. BROCKVILLE, July 30.—(Special.)—The death occurred here to-day of John Dargavel, for upwards of twenty years town clerk and treasurer, but long since retired. His whole life of 73 years was spent in Brockville and vicinity. Mr. Dargavel is survived by his wife and two children.

TO DREDGE ST. LAWRENCE. OTTAWA, July 30.—Dredging of the north channel of the St. Lawrence below Quebec to a depth of 85 feet, is recommended to the government by the chief engineer of the St. Lawrence. Eighteen million feet of material would have to be removed and an elevator dredge and barges costing \$500,000 would have to be built.
