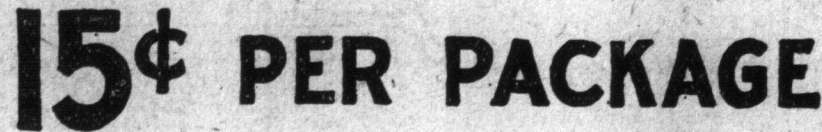

Tokio, Aug. 23.—Rice stores and twenty houses have been destroyed in the prefecture of Yamaguchi by a mob numbering several thousand. In combats with the police twelve rioters were killed and seven slightly wounded. In Tokio there have been one thousand arrests since the beginning of the rice riots.

The unrest in the country has affected the mining districts, several strikes and disturbances being reported.
