

Turf Two Favorite at 5 to 1 For the English Derby

COURTSHIP REPEATS IN PERSHING HANDICAP

Defeating Franklin and Waukeag in Grueling Feature at New Orleans.

New Orleans, La., Jan. 12.—The Fair Grounds yesterday afternoon was in better shape than all week. The General Pershing Handicap, an event at a mile and a half, with \$1500 added, went to G. A. Marshall's consistent son of Phoenix, Courtship, after a grueling stretch duel with Franklin and Waukeag. It was Courtship's second victory out of three starts since arriving in New Orleans.

The Johnnie Powers Memorial Handicap, which had its second running, was won by W. C. O'Brien's Garry Hermann gelding, Pickwick, with Pepper second and Bon Tromp third. Pickwick, strongly supported by the crowd, was sent to the post favorite and his victory also was a popular one.
