Longboat Wins 5 Mile Race Only Second Behind Record

The regatta of the Queen City Yacht Club on Saturday was one of the most successful ever held on the bay. With a fresh breeze blowing from the south west and just a suggestion of white caps to make things a bit lively, sailing conditions were quite ideal and both craft for fine and motorboat events were most spectacular. All the fixtures were on the program, and, besides these, there was an additional race for fine and motorboat as well as usually large number of sailing craft of various classes entered, all the clubs being well represented.
