SIR JULIAN PAUNCEFOTE Is to Be Raised to the Peerage-

Will Be Announced To-Day. London, June 1.—It has been definitely ascertained by the Associated Press that Sir Julian Paunéefote, the British Ambassa-dor to the United States, and head of the British delegation at the Peace Conference, will be elevated to the peerage, and that the announcement will be made in the list of the Queen's birthday honors, which will be issued to-morrow.

Tunnel From England to Ireland. London, June 1.—The Marquis of London-derry has consented to preside at a meet-ing within the next ten days in a commit-tee room of the House of Commons, when a statement will be made of a project for constructing a tunnel between England and Ireland.






