PENSION INCREASES.

[Manitoba Free Press.] A statement by the British pension board to parliament on December 19 last showed that the Canadian pensions were more liberal than, those of Canadian pensions were more liberal than those of any other country. The total disability pension (weekly rate) given by the different countries was:

Canada, 47s 11d; Britain, New Zealand and South Africa, 40s; Australia, 30s; France, 37s; Italy, 19s 4d; United States, 28s 10d. The Canadian treatment was reported to be similarly favorable for dependents and partially disabled men. On December 24, however, the United States raised their total disability pension from \$365 for a man without dependents, and \$910 for a married man with three children, to \$960 and \$1,250 respectively.
