SIXTEEN CANADIANS IN SECOND STAGE OF SHOOT. Record Number For King's Prize - St. George's Challenge Vase Competition.

BISLEY CAMP, July 22.-So far out of 16 competitors in which the colonial marksmen have competed, the mother country has won 8, Canada 7, and the United States 1.

The Canadian wins are: Kolopore Cup, Mackinnon Cup, Jubilee Cup, Prince of Wales, Sgt. Blackburn, Winnipeg Cup, Sgt. Bayles, Birmingham M. and M. Cup, Sgt. Blackburn, Daily Graphic Cup, Sgt. Smith, Ottawa, Sgt. Richardson also won the A.C. Sprinks, which competition prizes the total score in the Alexandra, Daily Graphic, Daily Telegraph and Graphic.

Corp. Albert Sprinks of the 10th Corp. Grenadiers, Toronto, won the shoot-off for first place in the first stage of the King's prize to-day. Pte. McCue of the 9th Argyle Highlanders, who had been tied with the other competitors at the three ranges, succeeded in making 3-4, a magpie, a bull and an inner, or a total of 12 for three shots.

The second stage, in which 300 competitors are still left, will be fired off on Friday and the third and final stage between the best hundred on Saturday, the St. George's.

First prize in the St. George's is a vase, dragon cup, sold cross and 230. There are 235 prizes altogether, totaling \$400.

Col. Sgt. Freeman of Hamilton, for the highest aggregate of the team, wins the Canada Club gold watch. Capt. Mitchell, who has his second, takes the Strathcona Cup.

The Canadian garden party was largely attended to-day, among those present being Hon. Messrs. Fliebling, Brodeur, Sir F. Borden, Col. Sherwood and Lord Strathcona. The latter presented the prizes to Freeman and Mitchell, and congratulated the team on its great success.

Several Canadians competed in the Barlow, being Hon. Messrs. Fliebling, except Sgt. Blackburn of Winnipeg, who was 7th, winning \$1.
