PRINCE ALBERT.

It was unanimously agreed to appoint the Rev. W. MacWilliam of Streetsville to Prince Albert, for a term of three years, at a salary of \$1400, in the hope that at least \$1000 per annum will be contributed by the field.

It was agreed to direct the attention of the Foreign Mission committee to the undesirability of asking Mr. Sinclair or any of the missionaries under the Home Mission committee, to undertake work in connection with the management of the mission property at Prince Albert.

APPOINTMENTS.

Messrs. D. S. McPherson, W. G. Mills and Jas. F. Smith, (students) were appointed to Manitoba for six months.

It was reported to the committee that Mr. Holmes, a graduate of Princeton, had gone to Manitoba to labor for six months, and that Mr. J. F. Dustin had declined the appointment of the committee made at its March meeting.

BRITISH COLUMBIA.

CARRIBOO.

An application from Dr. Watt of Carriboo for the appointment of a missionary to this field was referred to the executive sub-committee.

NEW WESTMINSTER.

It was agreed at the request of Rev. R. Jamieson, to reduce the grant to St. Andrew's Church, New Westminster to \$500 per annum, from 1st July, 1883.

There was laid on the table and read a lengthened correspondence between the convener and parties in Victoria and New Westminster, in regard to the work in British Columbia, including the minutes of a recent meeting of the congregation of St. Andrew's Church, New Westminster as to its future presbyterial connection; as also a letter from the convener of the Colonial committee of the Church of Scotland, with the finding of the General Assembly of said Church in regard to British Columbia. After full consideration it
