TOKIO, Jan. 6.—Thousands of workmen are preparing to transform the Shinjuku Imperial gardens, scene of the annual cherry blossom festival, into a place of sombre splendour for the funeral of the late Emperor Yoshihito.

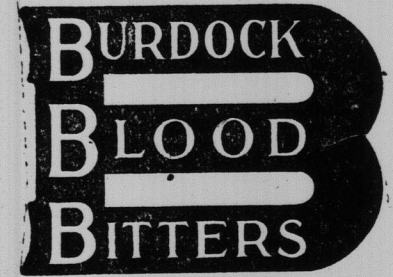

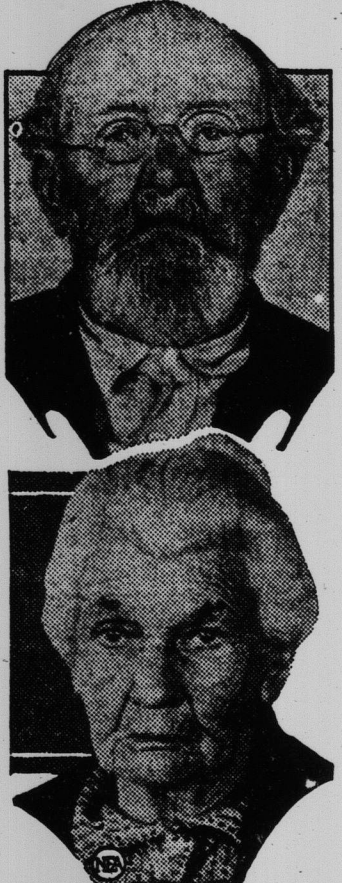

IMMIGRANTS OF FINE TYPE COMING

Dr. Page, Ottawa, on Annual Visit of Inspection, Praises Settlers

Dr. J. D. Page, of the Department of Health and Chief of the Division of Quarantine Immigration, Ottawa, at the city yesterday afternoon and is registered at the Royal Hotel.

Dr. Page is on his annual inspection of Canadian ports, in which he visits all ports from Prince Rupert, B. C. to Sydney, N. S. In conversation with a Times-Star reporter, he said a very fine type of immigrants were now coming to Canada. The number coming will be greater than that of any year since before the war.

When questioned about the mission of August Jonsson, who is investigating British Columbia and the Maritime Provinces in the interests of a body of Swedish settlers who are coming to Canada, Mr. Page said that in all probability Mr. Jonsson would find the Maritimes more suitable to the Nordic settlers on account of its similar climatic conditions and splendid farming conditions.

In stressing the need of immigrants for the Maritimes Dr. Page pointed out that its population was made up of only two per cent. immigrants, while that of the other provinces was thirty per cent. Dr. Page will leave for Halifax on Friday.
