

CLAY PIPE INDUSTRY DEAD.
Factory in Bristol Closed After 200
Years' Existence
London, Dec. 31.—At Bristol the last
kiln for making clay tobacco pipes was
recently lighted in the presence of

representatives of three generations of
the firm of George and Co., prepara-
