U. N. B. CLOSES 120TH YEAR

Fredrickton, May 14—The one hundred and twentieth year of the University of New Brunswick was brought to a successful close yesterday. Degrees were granted and addresses delivered by Dr. Murray MacLennan and Dr. Duff Campbell. The Montgomery Medal for Woodstock, the cash prize donated by Dr. S. McFarlane; Miss E. Hasen Allen, the alumnae prize; Col. H. Montgomery Campbell, the Montgomery Medal; and the Nocton scholarship, and Hon. F. B. Carvell, former M. P., the W. W. Whitehead memorial prize. Others were presented as follows: The Douglas gold medal, by Sir Douglas Hazen; the Brydson gold scholarship, by H. H. Hagerman; the Ketchum medal, by Dr. W. W. White; the city of Fredericton medal by Mayor Reid; the Sir Williams Taylor medal, by Mrs. G. N. C. Hawkins; the Purves-Loggie memorial scholarship by R. D. Hanson; the I. O. D. E. prize by Dr. C. C. Jones and the Currie memorial prize by Dr. B. C. Foster.

Three degrees were conferred honoris causa. They were degrees of LL.D. and Sc.D. conferred upon William McInnis B.A., directing geologist of the Geological department of Canada who is recommended by the Associated Alumnae of the University of New Brunswick, and Prof. A. W. Duff of Worcester Polytechnic Institute, Worcester (Mass.), distinguished graduates of the university. During the proceedings it was announced that the subject for the city of Fredericton gold medal in 1921 would be senior organic chemistry.

The subject for the English essay for the Douglas gold medal was announced as "The development of the English novel." English prose to be translated into latin prose for the alumnae gold medal was announced as Smith's History of Greece, chapter 20, sections 4 and 5.

Tonight the annual candlemas dance was held by the senior class in the university gymnasium. The dance always is regarded as the farewell to the friends among the citizens of Fredericton and was largely attended.

BOARD OF TRADE

Transportation Matters Taken Up at Council Meeting Yesterday.

The council of the board of trade met yesterday and the new tariff of rates between St. John and Nova Scotia points was explained by Mr. Tompkins, C. N. R. freight manager. A committee composed of Mr. E. Agar, H. C. Schofield and the secretary, was named to co-operate with the Commercial Club, Rotary Club, Tourist Association and city authorities in regard to the reception to be tendered the National Editorial Association of the United States upon their visit to St. John next month.

A letter was read from the trade and commerce department advising that, for reasons of economy, the subsidy to the steamer Ruby L., which plies between St. John's, had been cancelled. The matter was referred to the coastal committee to be followed up.

F. L. Rising was elected a member of the council in the place of H. W. Rising, who retired.

It was reported that a recommendation had been made to the management of the Canadian Government Marine favoring a monthly sailing from this port to Jamaica during the summer months. No reply has yet been received from the company.
