is now in the hands of the public. He then gave a cheer for the new king, and then joined him with

enthusiasm. Turning to his son, he addressed to him a few touching words of advice, and then swore

allegiance to him. He kissed the young king, and the regent, and dismissed the assembly. The regent entrusted the

formation of the cabinet to the king. The new cabinet has been formed

and has resigned on two of its members being appointed regent. A foreign minister

has been named. The Regency will take Skopje for a period of six months.

No regret was expressed for Milan's abdication.
