THE WIND BLOWING WITH ALMOST HURRICANE FORCE.

Disaster Vessels seen through the mist and spray. The storm has been raging continuously since Monday night.

NEW YORK, Sept. 12.—No language can picture the terrible scene along the coast. The wind is blowing with almost hurricane force driving the rain with a force that one like it.

The half mile reach of sand between the town and coast is a tossing billowy ocean bearing wreckage on every wave. Through the mist of spray and foam the tattered sails in a naked mass of spires of desecrated and dismantled vessels are dimly seen.
