The time occupied for lifting a full car through the shaft is only a minute. A gentleman, who has recently descended this shaft, speaks of it as follows: "A person of weak nerves should not brave the ordeal by descending the Pittsville shaft. The machinery works as smoothly as a hand elevator, but the speed is terrific that one cannot fall through the air. The knees after a few seconds become weak and tremulous the cars ring as the drums of the engine are forced inward by the air pressure, and the eyes shut involuntarily as the beams of the shaft seem to dash upward only a foot or two away.
