## Sporting News

LONDON, July 3.-James E. Sullivan, the President of the A. A. U., manager of the American Olympic team, has received a telegram from the State Department at Washington, announcing that President Roosevelt has appointed him United States Commissioner at the Olympic games, and that Ambassador Reid has been instructed to notify the British Olympic Association to that effect.

LONDON, July 3.-Tommy Burns, the champion heavyweight pugilist, will leave here for Australia on July 7. He has signed articles for three fights during the visit of the United States team to Australian waters. His first fight will be with Bill Lang, who is credited with being the best Australian heavy weight. This will take place in Melbourne. He will also fight against, whom he recently defeated in London. The Australian promoter has guaranteed Burns \$25,000 for the three contests.

SAN FRANCISCO, July 3.-Stanley Ketchell, the middleweight champion, and Jim Flynn, were matched yesterday to fight in this city between July 4th and 21st, the exact date to be chosen later. The men will meet at catch weights. Flynn is a heavy weight.

LONDON, July 3.-Efforts are being made by the American and English rowing men to arrange a race between Harvard and Cambridge after the Olympic course at Henley the day after the Olympic races, but all the members of the crew have not yet been consulted.

This course is only about a mile and three quarters, or about 2 miles shorter than the Putney course.

SAN FRANCISCO, July 3.-The sale of seats for the Gans-Nelson fight continues heavy and from present indications a \$20,000 gate is a certainty. All the cheaper seats have been disposed of and the sale of the higher paid chairs is proceeding briskly. There is ample Gans money in sight, but the Nelson end is inconsiderable. The odds of 2 to 1 on Gans still predominate, and in some instances bets are being made that the champion will win inside of 20 rounds in which even money is the ruling figure.

CAMBRIDGE, July 3.—It has been definitely decided that the Harvard varsity crew which defeated Yale will not go to England during the present summer. The receipt of a telegram yesterday by Robert F. Herriek, chairman of the graduate rowing committee at Harvard from Rudolph Lehmann, the English rowing coach, ended all hopes of a trip to England by the Crimson crew. Mr. Lehmann, in his telegram said: "Cambridge, having to row in Olympic regatta is regretfully compelled to decline further races this season."

## JAPANESE SOLDIER PROMPTLY PUNISHED

Made Trouble at Ping Yang—Marques Not Determined to Protect Foreigners

SEOUL, July 3.—A Japanese soldier ran amok yesterday through the American Methodist premises at Ping Yang and assaulted a Korean caretaker with a bayonet, chasing him through the missionary residence section. The American Consul, when informed of the affair, called it to the attention of the Japanese Embassy and demanded punishment of the soldier. By order of Prince Ito, Resident-General, the soldier was arrested and immediately sentenced to two months hard labor. The colonial major, captain and lieutenant of the regiment to which the soldier belonged will all be disciplined by a confinement of from three to seven days. The prompt action of Prince Ito is significant of the determination of Japan's insistence on American home and the disciplining of the officers was due to the fact that soldiers of the same regiment participated in the burning of an American Presbyterian Mission School building in Wiji. In that case all damages were repaired by the regiment general.

## MEXICAN GOVERNMENT MUST ACT PROMPTLY

Conference Indicates That Conditions are Rather Serious

DEL RIO, Tex., July 3.—Developments in a conference held at Las Vegas, Mexico, yesterday, between Colonel Alberto Duran, commanding the Mexican forces and Capt. Aguirre, of the Custom office and several United States civil and military officers show conditions to be serious and one that demands prompt action upon the part of the Mexican government. Following the conference, Col. Duran admitted that the situation had been serious but he thought the forces of the revolutionists had been broken up and the only trouble expected now is from small bands travelling over the state. These he claims are being pursued by soldiers. It is understood warlike will be issued for the arrest of a number of Mexicans located on this side of the river.

## UNIVERSITY ENDOWMENT NOW HALF A MILLION

LONDON, July 3.—The Oxford University endowment fund which was inaugurated by Lord Curzon on his election to the Chancellorship, has reached \$500,000 and W. W. Astor has given his second donation of \$50,000 which he promised on March 12 last. Mr. Astor's total donation amounts to \$100,000.
