

NEW CAB REGULATION IS IN EFFECT TODAY

Lighted Lamps Must be on Cabs from 7 p. m. Until Daylight—Cabmen Prepare for Change

Beginning today the regulation obliging all cab drivers to carry lights will become effective, and henceforth the cabs about the city will carry lighted lamps between seven o'clock in the evening and daylight.

Although the regulation has been on the books for several years it has not been enforced for a long time. The instructions in regard to the lights were issued about three weeks ago by Chief Clerk, although the cabmen demurred on the ground that it would mean considerable expense equipping their vehicles with lights.

The regulation requires that the vehicles must be equipped with two lights which shall be lighted after 8 o'clock at night and until daylight during the months of May, June, July and August, and from 7 o'clock in the evening until daylight during the winter months. On each of the lamps there must be placed the waste time of the cab, each number must be at least one half inch in length.

Some of the cabbies have equipped their cabs with the lights, and the unusual spectacle of lighted lamps on a few of the cabs last evening attracted considerable attention.

Perry left Halifax Thursday for Florida for the winter, engaging in the passenger service with the Peninsular and Oriental Navigation Company.

The Governor Cobb, of the Eastern Corporation line will also go south this winter. The Calvin Austin will perform the Boston and St. John service.
