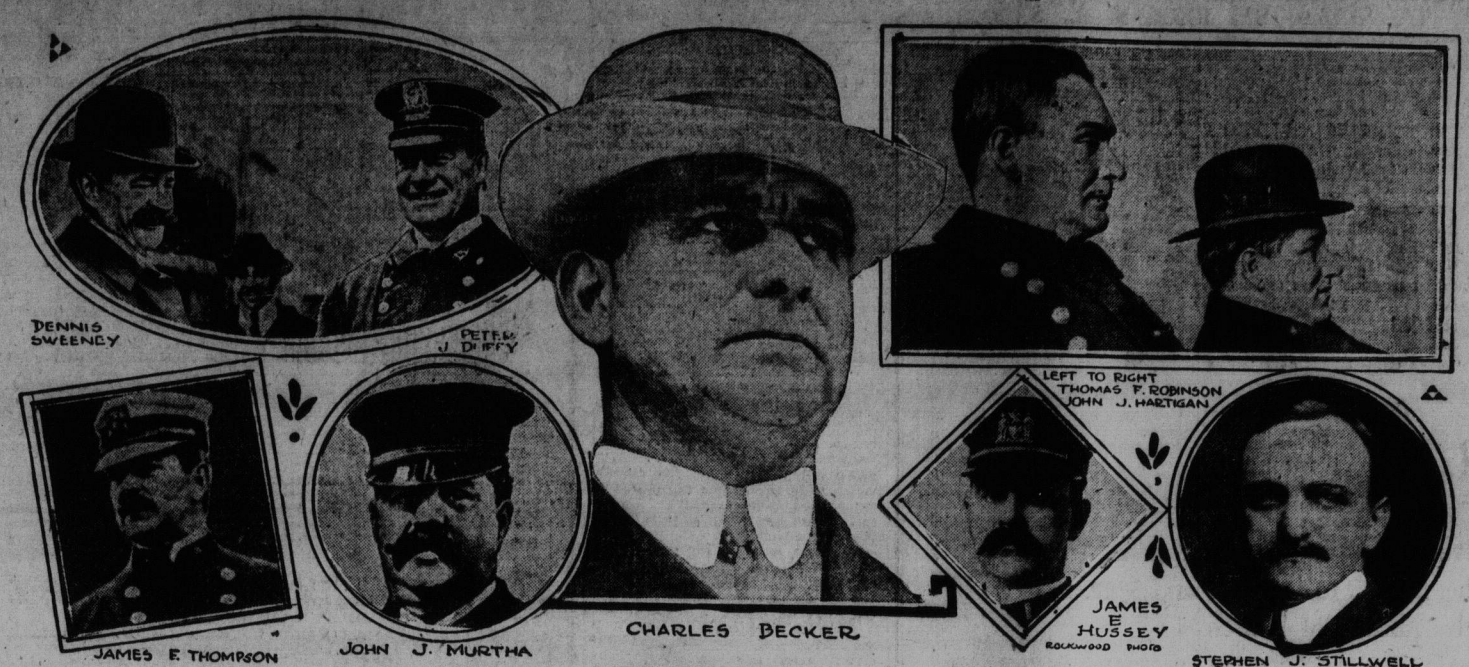


TERROR STRICKEN, DISHONEST NEW YORK STATE POLITICIANS ASK WHO NEXT IN MARCH OF GRAFTERS TO PRISON



Public revolt against the thievery by public officials has set to music the golden tinkle of the dollars of graft. The "Rogues' March" is shilling louder and louder in accompaniment to the clank of fetters as grafters after grafters join the procession that in New York State has led five grafters to Sing Sing, four to Blackwell's island and started on these journeys within the last seven weeks a country political boss, a one-time Representative in Congress, their henchmen and a Tammany district leader with his humble but effective aid in grafting. And the end of that procession is not in sight. Who's next?

"Curly Joe" Cassidy, long democratic boss of Queens, and Louis T. Walter, his lieutenant, were convicted within a week of conspiring to sell the democratic nomination for Supreme Court Justice, in the Long Island district, in 1911, to William Willett, who had represented a Brooklyn constituency in Congress. Willett was convicted of buying that nomination.

"Barry" Dunn, Tammany leader of the Eighteenth Assembly district, in New York State, and for many years democratic State committee man and a power in politics, was convicted with his Dunbar Contracting Company and Joseph G. Fogarty, tool of Dunn, of conspiring to defraud the State in the construction of public highways in Rockland county.

If the appeals of Cassidy and Willett are overruled and they go to Sing Sing to serve their terms of from twelve to eighteen months and a day additional for every dollar unpaid of their \$1,000 fines, they will find their old friends, Robinson and Duffy, and the police grafters' tool, Harigan, there. If Dunn and Fogarty ever serve their sentences of ten months each in the Surin, Hursey and Thompson, whose sentences will have expired long before the appeals in the later cases can be decided.

GIVEN UP FOR LOST.

St. John's, Nfld., Feb. 20.—The British schooner Grand Falls, forty-two days from Harbor Breton for Oporto, fish laden, and not reported since her departure on January 7, has been given up here for lost, with a full crew of eight men.

The Gay Gordon, a British schooner, from Cadiz for Bellora, Nfld., is overdue. She sailed January 10, and has not been reported.

Owing to a severe storm sweeping over the colony during the past forty-eight hours, steamers and trains are much delayed. The coastal steamer Prosper, which was to have sailed on Tuesday, was unable to leave this port until last night.

DANGERS TO NAVIGATION.

New York, Feb. 20.—Stmr Columbus (Br.), from Glasgow, reports Feb. 12, lat 45 38, lon 44 06, passed a small iceberg.

Stmr Kassanga (Br.), reports Feb. 18, 27 miles south of Ambrose Channel lightship, passed two large spars. (Reported to the Hydrographic Office.)

The Sable Island radio station radiographed to Stmr Oceanic (Br.), Feb. 6, that about 100 miles south of Sable Island a red and black striped automatic gas and whistling buoy with occulting light marked "Sheet Harbor" was sighted.

Stmr Shenandoah (Br.), radiographed that on Feb. 8, in lat 46 21, lon 45 47, passed south of an iceberg.

Stmr Grampian (Br.), radiographed on Feb. 8, in lat 46 35, lon 46 16, passed a growler and an iceberg.

Stmr California (Br.), radiographed that on Feb. 8, in lat 46 30, lon 46 58, passed south of a large field of ice, and lat 46 31, lon 46 29, an iceberg about 700 feet long and 40 feet high.

Stmr Potsdam (Dutch), reports Feb. 13, lat 40 29 N, lon 55 05 W, passed a small projecting about 5 feet out of water, with rigging attached, apparently fast to submerged wreckage.

Portland, Me., Feb. 19.—The fire boat performed good service yesterday as an ice breaker, clearing out the channel at Peaks Island and rescuing the three-masted schooner William E. Mitchell, which was surrounded with drift ice. Later the steamer went out.

Boston, Feb. 19.—Stmr Onondaga, which arrived today from Jacksonville and Charleston, reports encountered northwesterly gales and heavy seas Numidian 124 miles east, bound Halifax.

LOST ANCHORS.

Philadelphia, Feb. 19.—Schr Oakley C. Curtis, from Portland for Philadelphia, was reported about 8 miles off Cape Henric today with loss of both anchors. Tug Triton towed her to Philadelphia.

STEAMERS IN COLLISION.

Steamers Celtic (Br.), Hambleton, from Alexandria, Feb. 13, for Naples and New York, and Madoune (Fr.), Dechelles, from Marseilles Feb. 14, for Providence and New York, have been in collision at Naples and both vessels are damaged.

CORINTHIAN AND NUMIDIAN.

The Allan Line steamer Corinthian was 120 miles east of Sable Island Feb. 19, at 7 p. m., bound from Havre for St. John.

The Allan Line steamer Numidian was 124 miles east of Sable Island at 3 p. m., on the 15th, bound for Halifax.

DUE AT HALIFAX TOMORROW.

The Allan Line steamer Alsatian will reach Halifax tomorrow on her second trip. She is bringing 52 cabin, 165 second cabin and 315 third class passengers.

The ship was 510 miles southeast of Cape Race Feb. 19th at 5.33 p. m. The ship has on board besides passengers and freight 240 bags and 550 packages of parcel post.

LACK OF JUDGMENT.

London, Feb. 20.—It is understood that eight per cent. of the bond issue of the Canada Steamship Lines has been left on the hands of the underwriters. The Financial News makes the comment that the issue seems to have been almost the least successful of the year, and it was evident that there had been a lack of judgment somewhere on the part of the management in launching it.

STEAMER'S RUDDER GONE.

Queensdown, Feb. 19.—The steamer Rotterdam (Dutch, tank), from Amsterdam Feb. 9 for New York, before reported returning to this port with rudder gone and being steered by a steam trawler, is drifting in a strong gale 50 miles south of here with her machinery disabled. Two trawlers are standing by endeavoring to render assistance to the distressed vessel, but are unable to do so, owing to the heavy sea running.

SCHOONERS ICE BOUND.

A request for assistance of the American schooner Herald, St. John, N. B., for New York, ice bound in St. Mary's Bay, N. B., was received at the Custom House, Portland, Me., on Thursday. It was expected that the revenue cutter Woodbury would be sent to aid the Herald after taking on coal. The schooner is said to be in no danger.
