Set Peace Time Ship Record.

Two riveters and their helpers in
the North Drydock and repair yards
of Fifty-sixth street, Brooklyn,
have made records which compare
favorably with those achieved by oth-
er shipyards during the war, when
such work was at top speed. The
riveters are John Canton and Victor
Cobaltin.

Canton and his two helpers, work-

ing on boiler hatches, where five-
eighths rivets have to be driven fast
with the steel for water-tight joints,
drove 4,152 rivets in eight days, or
an average of 1,114 rivets every eight
hours. Sobottin and his helpers
drove 5,769 in six days, or 960 rivets
a day.
