Few Stars At Yale In Field Athletics

New Haven, Conn., April 7.—Yale has had much better track prospects in the past than those which loom up before "Johnny" Mack this spring.

The genial trainer is doing his best to uncover some material that would make the chances fair for the squad to hold its own against Harvard and Princeton, but at this writing the task seems to be a hopeless one. However, Mack has developed track and field athletes out of what looked like pretty crude material in the indoor work and he may repeat this season.

Yale has in Capt. F. P. Hefelfinger one of the best middle distance runners in the college, and the nephew of the giant "Pudge" is expected to make it interesting for opponents in all events in which he is entered. In the dashes the Yale colors will be worn by Snyder, Jones and Cowles, all pretty fair men.

Hefelfinger, Stover and Cox are the best quarter milers in college, while in the half mile event O'Brien, Driscoll and Prier are expected to be heard from. Those runners give promise of doing fairly well in the meets to come, but Mack admits that there are no record breakers in the squad. O'Brien is one of Yale's best runners. He and Seaman and Reed will likely be the choice of the coach for the mile event.

For the two mile Yale has Crosby, Ellis and Dudley. There are three good hurdlers in college—Shedden, a brother of a former Yale track captain; T. P. Hefelfinger and Williams.

Yale is not overstrong in the field events. Hamill, Kirkpatrick, both football men, and Stover will enter the shot put, while Acosta, Kirkpatrick and Hudson will do the hammer throwing. Sweeney, Webber, Gardner, Roberts and Barrett are doing the best work in the pole vault.

Lamson will do Yale's best high jumping during the next two months and his team mates in this event will likely be Potter, Rehnacker, T. P. Hefelfinger and Gardner are the racing broad jumpers.

Yale's first meet in the dual meet with Princeton, on the first Saturday in May.

Stecher Won From Finlander

New York, April 9.—Joe Stecher, world's heavyweight catch-as-catch-can wrestling champion, threw Fred Plakoff, of Finland, with a body slippers in 22 minutes and 5 seconds tonight. Stecher weighed 208 pounds and his opponent 210. The challenger gave a lively exhibition at the end of the match by the champion.
