ment, for the better Protection of the Trade of this Kingdom, and for othtr Purpoles, to the contrary notwithftanding.

Fefilis not to fail from the Port of St. Fotris without Consoy or Licence, while any Perfon authorized to srantLieences iball be refident thereat.

Policies of Infurance not to be void on Veffels, etc. failing from Ncrejounaland or Labradior without Convoy, nor any Penalty to be incarred.
II. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That nothing in this AEt fhall exrend, or be conftrued to extend, to permit or allow any Ship or Veffel to fail or depart from the Port of Saint Y̌oln's, in the faid Ifland of Neaifoundland, without being under the Protection of Convoy, or without Licence being firft obtained for that Purpofe, during the Time any Admiral, or other Perfon duly authorized by the Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, or by the Commiffoners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral for the Time being, to grant Livences for permitting Ships or Veffels to fail or depart without being under the Protection of Convoy, fhall be ftationed or refident at the said Port of Saint Fobn's.
III. And be it further enacted, That nothing in the before recited Act paffed in the laft Seflion of Parliament fhall extend, or be conftrued to extend, to rendei null or void any Policy of Infurance made or to be made on any Ship or Veffel, or on the Goods or Merchandize laden therein, on account of fuch Ship or Veffel failing or departing from the Illand of Ncrufoundland or Coaft of Labrador, without being under the Protection of Convoy, under the Authority of this Act, nor fhall any Penalty be incurred by any Mafter or Commander of any Ship or Veffel, or by any other Perfon whatever, on account of any Ship or Veffel failing or departing, under the Authority of this Act, from the faid Ifland of Nerufoundland or Coaft of Labrador, without being accompanied with and under the Protection of Convoy.
