# rotesting children get bus service

The 50 Erindale children who demanded a bus out-side the Peel County Board of Education rode to school

vesterday. Small children, spearheaded by parents, staged a demonstration Thursday because they didn't want to cross Dundas Highway.

Parents threatened to keep children out of Springfield School if bus service was not provided.

"I'd rather let my sixvear-old be ignorant than send her out on that highway." said Dr. Paul Mahoney, Robinson Drive.

WANT BUS In a protest that rivalled

the one staged by farmers in Queen's Park, children shouted, "we want a bus, for over two hours. They were met on the steps by J. A. Turner, director of education, who referred them to the Safety Council.

An emergency meeting of the sidewalk committee was called Thursday night by Counsellor Harold Kennedy and the bus service was announced Friday.

Allan Verch, spokesman for the board of education. told demonstrators who gathered again Friday that a

temporary bus would take them to school.

He said the Mississauga Safety Council and township engineering department will survey the school route along Dundas Highway and Woodlands

Springfield.
Mrs. Mahoney said Friday parents would not be satisfied with "temporary

### service. DISCONTINUED

Earlier this year the service was discontinued by the board of education after the Mississauga Safety Council said traffic hazards did not warrant a bus.

The distance from Erindale to Springfield P.S. on Credit Woodlands is un-der the two-mile limit required for bus transportation.

The demonstration started at the Presbyterian Church in Erindale Children carried placards and mothers followed pushing baby carriages and shout-ing as they paraded around in front of the building.
Mrs. Don Robillard, mo-

ther of two, said she has a four-year-old who would have to cross the highway. "If there's no bus I'll keep him home," she said.

She was supported by Mrs. E. Bowers, Mrs. Ron Hab-kirk and Mrs. G. Brinkman who were marching with their children.

WISE GUYS Protestor Oliver Kell-hammer, 10, said he was protesting because, "some wise guys in education won't give us a bus.

Doug Simms, a Gr. 7 student, said it was a "nona safety guard) to Dundas Cres. N. Then the child-Cres. N. Then the child-ren would walk along the wooded area of the Cres-cent until they reach the intersection Woodlands Rd. and Dundas Cres. N.

He said children had to walk on a very uneven shoulder along Dundas The crescent Highway. is not paved.

He outlined the proposed route children were expected to take to school. It runs along Dundas Highway to a crosswalk (with Credit Woodlands is extremely busy during the hours the children would be on the road. They would walk the route four times each day

# DANGEROUS

"It will be very danger-ous in the winter." said. Dr. Mahoney.

He has learned that the cost of bus service would

be \$1,000 for one year.
"The board," he said, spends money on oak panelling and bathrooms administrators but refuses \$1,000 for children's safe-
