The grounds upon which the certificate should be revoked are not suggested in the despatch. It may, of course, be implied that the Certificate was procured for some ulterior purpose and that Moses did not intend to contineu residing in Canada at the time of the grant, but while this may be inferred from the letter, it is not expressly stated. For this reason the Secretary of State would have considerable difficulty in revoking the Certificate or making a recommendation to Council for its revocation.

The despatch also refers to a similar despatch of the 27th of January, 1923, regarding the case of Abraham Elrahy and asks whether such reports should continue to be made. I am directed by the Secretary of State to inform you that such reports are always acceptable, and while it may be that action cannot be taken on the case referred to; or on several other cases, very important information may be communicated in this way.
