- Q. 7 ~~Was~~ Was the Court of the opinion at the time the accused was convicted of this charge that this letter was a forgery?
- A. 7 The Court accepted the evidence of the calligrapher.
- Q. 8 Was the calligrapher the only witness that the writing on this note corresponded with the accused writing?
- A. 8 He was.
- Q. 9 Had Trooper Hawthorne been in the habit of receiving letters from Miss Buchanan?
- A. 9 To the best of my memory the accused stated in his evidence that he had handed over certain letters from Miss Buchanan to Hawthorne when Hawthorne was released from Detention.
- Q. 10 Have you any idea of the number handed over?
- A. 10 I think the accused in his evidence stated three or four.
