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We have just read a new volume by Mr. Guinness, 'LIGHT FOR THE LAST DAYS,' practically supplemental to the former work. In this last work, he applies with marked ability, to the system of interpretation for which he so ably argued in the earlier volume, the test of historical fulfilment. While we cannot agree with him in *all* his interpretations, we cannot but feel that he has conclusively vindicated the essential correctness of the PRINCIPLES of interpretation for which in 'The Approaching End' he gave us such a remarkable, able and original argument.
