

TREATMENT: REMOVAL BY CRUSHING IS THE PLAN OF SAFETY AND COMFORT

Convinced that the removal of stone by crushing was the proper way, but not satisfied, however, with anything short of perfection, our physicians at the Invalids' Hotel and Surgical Institute have devoted years of study to this disease, and have perfected methods of treatment and have become so skilful that they have relieved hundreds of patients of stone in the bladder without a fatality, and by a single operation in each case.

A moment's reflection will convince those afflicted with stone in the bladder of the great advantages of our method over the cutting operation, which is admittedly dangerous, requires the infliction of a deep wound, entails the loss of much blood, and generally produces severe shock; and also of its superiority over that variety of the crushing process which necessitates submitting to several successive treatments. Our patients seldom lose any blood, a few
