MANY PRISONERS WERE TAKEN IN THE SHEAVES

GALICIA IS WHERE RUSSIA IS MOST ACTIVE

German Re-inforcements in East Prussia Forced a Retirement.

(By Special Wire to the Courier) LONDON, Sept. 14, 4:30 a.m.—It is officially reported from Petrograd to the Exchange Telegraph Co., that the attention of the Russian staff is largely directed to Galicia. In East Prussia the military authorities left sufficient forces to maintain the occupied province, but insufficient to meet adequately the increasing German forces transported recently from the western theatre.

At the beginning of September the army of General Rennenkampf held positions in the Gerdauen (40 miles southeast of Koenigsberg) and Labiau. On the 7th the Germans began to advance eastward against Rennenkampf's forces to the south towards the Russian frontier through the Mazur Lakes.

On Sept. 10th the left flank of Rennenkampf's army appeared to be in danger and the Russians constantly retreated. The following day in order to stop the German advance in some places the Russian troops took a defensive. Fighting on this front continues.

CHICAGO, Sept. 12.—Rumors that a peace move on the part of Austria was not unlikely had a bearish effect today on wheat. Despite an early rally, the market closed heavy at a decline of 2 1/2c net up. Corn was up with a gain of 1/2c to 3/4c and oats with a rise of 1/2c to 3/4c. In provisions the market was a setback ranging from 15c to \$1.50.

WINNIPEG GRAIN MARKET.
WINNIPEG, Sept. 12.—The wheat market was weak generally, caused by reports of heavy receipts in the west and no export trade. Winnipeg opened unchanged to 1/2c higher, and finished 1/2c lower. The decline was gradual from the opening, few attempts being made to close, which was 1 1/2c lower for wheat options, and 3/4c to 1/2c lower for cash wheat, barley or flax.

APPALING LOSS

German Cavalry in France Has Been Almost Decimated.

(By Special Wire to the Courier) LONDON, Sept. 14.—A despatch to The Times from Paris says: "The German losses in cavalry are appalling. The inevitable effect of the German cavalry's retreat from the Olympia horse show a few years ago and is now a prisoner, estimates that the wastage in cavalry batteries for the German army is two-thirds of the total strength allotted to the army operating in the direction of Paris. The Germans flooded Belgium with reconnoitering parties, but they were hampered by an insufficiency of horses. Many horses had been taken from German batteries for the use of the cavalry, but despite this, large numbers of cavalrymen marched as infantrymen."
