The report that the Spence boys charged with aggravated assault upon Ed. Duffield at Charlton, on Saturday night the 22nd inst., were to get a preliminary hearing before P. M. Around Charlton and Athens but very little interest was manifested in the affair, the general feeling seeming to be that a hotel keeper would get out of bed on Saturday night and open up his bar for the accommodation of a party of roughts, and furnished them with drinks at the hour of 11 or 12 o'clock, should be willing to put up with a little row, and a few words, and a few squalling. The reports of the affair as published in the Brockville papers was also commented upon as exaggerated in many details. When the court opened at 11 a.m. on Thursday morning the only witnesses, a Reporter representative present from this section. He (Foster) pulled them apart and just then Duffield cried out "that the heart was kicked out of him." Some one brought a light to the door and he helped Duffield to a chair and subsequently up stairs to his apartment. He (Foster) saw that Duffield or Spence. Did not see Sam Spence strike any one or interfere in the fight. Mentioned to Mr. Fowler the next day that somebody took hold of his neck and said "let them alone" he was pulling Tom Spence off the floor. In conversation with Mr. Fisher, the witness could not say which one took hold of the other first as he was at the further end of the room. As he pulled Spence off from Duffield, he was pulled into the room and in the direction of Duffield's body but could not say whether it touched him or not, as the room was quite dark. Had known the Spence boys for years and don't remember ever seeing them the worse for anything, but he is positive that he saw the Spence boys on Saturday night. Witness was perfectly sober at the time the row took place. Remained with Duffield until the doctor came. There was a stove in room and the parties were near it when on the floor.

Dr. J. H. Hart of Athens, said he was called upon to attend Duffield early on Sunday morning. Found him lying on the floor, and he was in two ribs on the left side. There was no abrasion of the skin over the fractured ribs, simply a discoloration of the skin. The only other bruise he observed was a slight one on the left side. Called to see him on Wednesday afternoon and found him mending gradually. Do not think there is any fear of a relapse, and do not consider his case a critical one.

The selection of a leader who can successfully guide the party through the crisis will be one of great difficulty as there are so many conflicting interests to be harmonized.

At the time of going to press, the latest telegrams say that there is no change in the premier's condition and no hope for his recovery.

An order has just been issued by Secretary Rush instructing all revenue officials of the U.S. to enforce the order establishing a quarantine for all sheep and swine imported from Canada into the United States. The order says in effect that all sheep and swine shall be placed in quarantine at the port where landed, for the period of 15 days. This order will completely wipe out the sheep and swine export trade between Canada and the U.S. as with the duty now collected and the delay, feeding and shrinkage it will make a difference of fully \$1.50 in the price of sheep and lamb. We understand that orders have been sent to all the buyers for export to cease buying as there is no use trying to export animals under the present stringent laws. Farmers should castrate their ram lambs at once and hold them for the present, hoping that the obvious regulations may be repealed or modified so as to allow them a market.

Tanks containing 150,000 salmon fry reached the B. & W. station here last evening in charge of an employe of the Ottawa Fish Hatchery. Owing to delay in getting a conveyance to the station to take them to Charlton quite a few of the fish were dead when they reached the shore of the lake. We understand that a movement is on foot to petition the government to allow netting for white fish in the Charlton waters this fall. We hope the matter will be pushed successfully, as there is an immense amount of white fish in the lake that cannot be caught under the present regulations.
