DISCOVERING CANADA

Growing Tomatoes in Alberta

The production of tomatoes in
Alberta would not be a success in
the past, but prairie people are of a
type who are forever doing some-
thing which was never done before.
Messrs. D. E. Kerr and E. G. Kerr,
of Lethbridge, Alberta, have observed
for some years that tomatoes in
small quantities were measured in the
Lethbridge district, and decided
that in this manner, the experi-
ment should not be made on a com-
mercial scale. As a result about
two acres of tomatoes were set out
last summer in land farmed by Mr.
Kerr, 10 miles east of Lethbridge. The
plants were started under glass
in Lethbridge and set out on June 6,
7, and 8, at which time the vines
from 6 to 10 inches long. Three
hundred five hundred plants were
set in the plot, some of them
three feet apart and some four
feet apart. The experience of the
farmers seems to be that the
four foot plant is preferable.

The soil secured was an old pasture
which had since been in alfalfa and
is protected by a field border on
the north side. Kerr's farm is a very
rich loam with a gentle south slope
and, of course, is irrigated. The land
was cultivated in the ordinary way
and irrigation afterwards planned and
carried out.

The first of the ripe fruit was
available seven weeks after setting
out the plants, or about the end of
July. From six hundred pounds of
cutting ripe fruit was taken off the
plot each day and this rate of pro-
duction continued until the 1st of August
when the entire plot was set out
at \$25,000 per acre and a ready
market was found for the product in
the city of Lethbridge, the early ripe
tomatoes bringing twenty-five cents
a pound and the later ones \$1.00
a pound. The gross price of
\$25,000 pounds at the latter figure is
\$2,500.

According to Mr. Kerr, no diffi-
culty was experienced in the pro-
duction of this crop. The vines
were trimmed early in July for the
purpose of producing heavier fruit
and also advertising more numer-
ous flowers. The vines were trained
up to the middle of September no
damage had been experienced from
frost, although as a precautionary
measure, the vines had been draped
over the plot, so that should
it be started if necessary. Mr. Kerr
points out that the essential thing in
the production of this crop is irriga-
tion, and also the fact that the
tomatoes are so large and well
developed as the best imported stock
from British Columbia or Wash-
ington, and being local grown, they
are reached the consumer in bet-
ter condition. The crop was no heavy
