(To the Editor.)

Dear Sir:—Kindly allow me space in your much read paper to write on covetousness. Our loving Lord on one occasion said "Take heed and beware of covetousness, for a man's life consisted not in the abundance of the things which he possesseth." In St. Peter we read "And through covetousness shall they with feigned words make merchandise of you, whose judgment now of a long time lingereth not, and their damnation slumbereth not." In these days we do not always seem to be satisfied with the inheritance, but are continually grasping after something else. We think that if we can get a little ahead of someone else we are doing fine, forgetting that in many cases we are much the worse for it, we seem to think that we are put in this world to accumulate all the wealth we can, no matter how we get it. This is a grave mistake, sir, for while God expects us to do our duty, and to "earn our bread by the sweat of our brow," He does not intend that we should go to excess, and be continually coveting what the other person should very often have instead of ourselves. We are inclined to earn our bread in every way except the way laid down by God; we are most always after the easy way fearing that we are going to lose too much sweat, except at times when we have something in view that we think we are going to make a lot of money over, then we'll sweat ourselves half to

death to gain our purpose. We spur the path of duty, we are continually keeping our eyes open for a clever way to make a good sum of money quick, while at the time everything that's noble, pure, and uplifting to manhood seem to be shut off. It's a sad thing, sir, that in these days you cannot get people interested any farther than their pocket books are concerned. We have a book to hand entitled "Thy Kingdom Come," in which is found a paragraph after this sort: "This class embraces all who love not the golden rule of love, and who, instead of loving others as themselves, are willing to see others crushed, oppressed and denied their rights and the reasonable rewards and comforts of toil in order that they may luxuriate extravagantly. As David said, 'Their inward thought is, that their houses are to be forever their dwelling-places from generation to generation, they call them by their own names, they think their way is their folly; yet their posterity approve their sayings.' 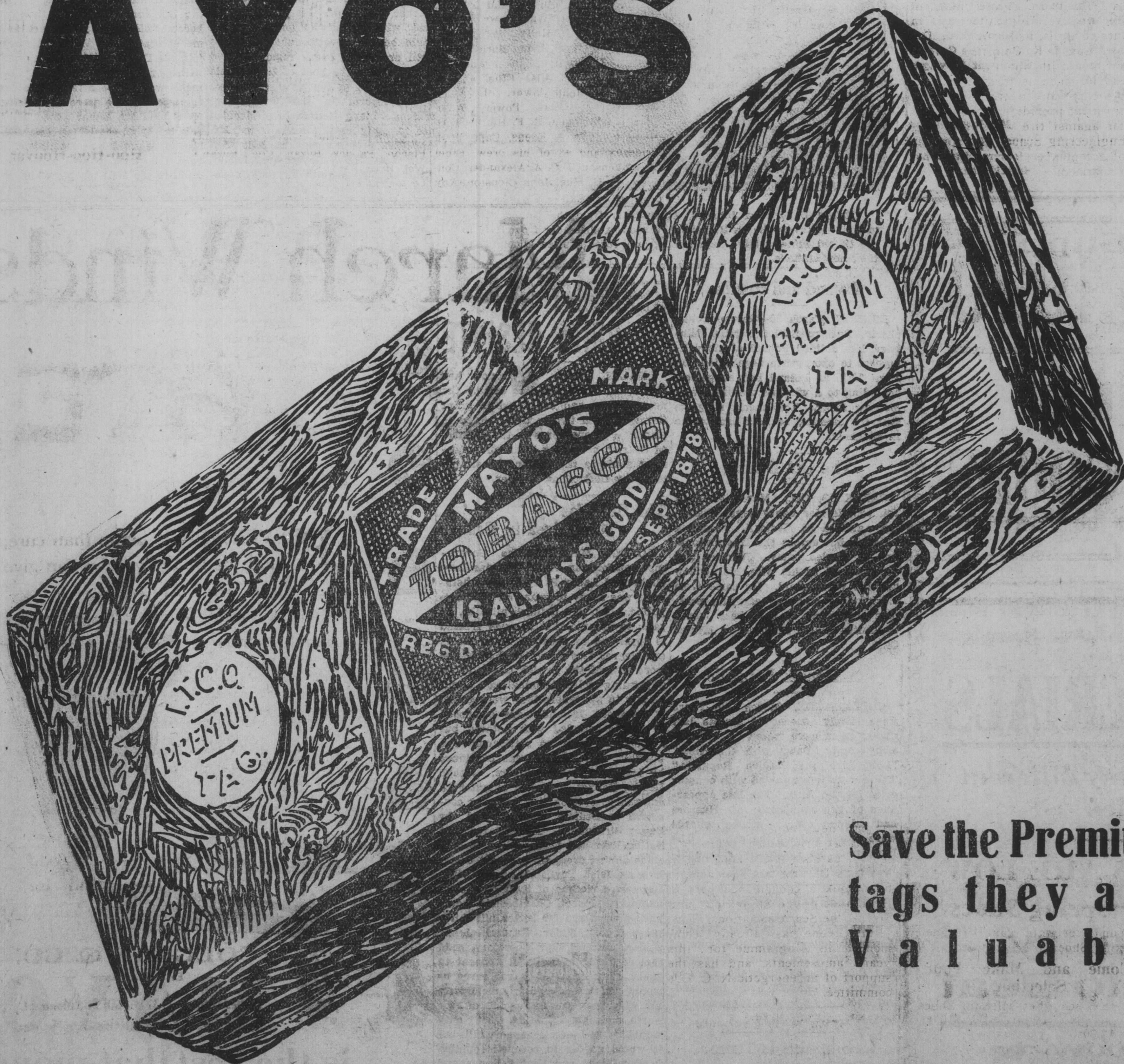
## FOOD SHORTAGE IN JAMACIA THREATENED

KINGSTON, Jamaica, British West Indies—The masses in this city are threatened with new and serious food troubles. The present high prices for shop food are a burden. Bread is priced at 4½d. (9 cents) for eight ounces, and new burdens are in sight. Almost the whole of the retail provision shop business is in the hands of the Chinese, who draw their supply from wholesale Chinese firms doing business here. The latter are experiencing the difficulty and loss

caused by the exchange situation. They complain that they are losing money by selling at the current rates to the retailers. The retailers on their side are held by the food controller to present prices. What threatens is that the retail business will be cut off from supplies and will have to shut down. That will be a very serious thing for the poorer classes.

Nearly two thousand homes have been provided by the Workers' Home Board of Western Australia without cost to the taxpayer. The board buys and builds for applicants, who repay the cost in fortnightly instalments.
