FREDERICTON, Feb. 24, 1872.

DEAR EDITOR:
I made my advent here last evening to arrange some private matters before the engrossing business of the Legislative Session commences next week.

There is great commotion to-day among the political politicians and considerable drouth, making frequent visits to Joe Muzerol's indispensable. The exciting cause is the Westmorland Election, as upon that depends the fate of the Government. If Chapman be elected it is thought they will be defeated on the address, and it is doubtful if even Humphrey's success will enable them to weather the storm. It is said here that they will secure the Catholic element in the Legislature by sacrificing the School Bill, but if they attempt that game it is more than probable His Honor Lemuel A. Wilnot will give them their walking ticket. The bets here on your election are in favor of Chapman, but I hope they will be unsuccessful. Everything is very quiet just now. Fredericton is too large a city to indulge in gossip, but the ladies will talk, and the fact of Mrs. T. not having the fear of her spiritual pastor before her eyes, in giving a large party to people of the world, who pranced through her Ball room to the melodies of a beautiful string band, until three o'clock in the morning, has excited terrible visions among the pious of coasting down hill on a couple of barrel staves, or back-sliding as the boys call it, and poor Mr. T. has been subjected to Church discipline for violation of Mr. Wesley's rule. He, so the ladies say, took the reproof in a very likable manner, and expressed himself willing to be put on the penitential bench, provided the Church first exercised its authority upon Brother Lemuel Allen, who a great saint, a great Sunday School teacher, and advocate of total abstinence, had introduced wines to his table, dispensing it in his hospitalities, not only to Joe Muzerol's friends, but to the College Students, in violation of a stringent rule of the venerable founder of Wesleyism, and in opposition to his life-long precepts.
